





SHIP ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Ferries arrive and depart from Port of Frederikshavn up to thirty times daily. In addition to ordinary ferry traffic, there are frequent arrivals at the shipyards and general tramp trade. Furthermore, the approach area and outer harbour are used for traffic to and from the Frederikshavn Naval Base.

Therefore, it is crucial for all ships to stay informed about other traffic. Ferries particularly need to be notified well in advance about the movements of other ships, as they cannot deviate from the scheduled navigation during their final approach without risking fatal consequences.

Therefore, all ships must follow the guidelines below:

Notification of arrival and departure on VHF channel 12

For arrival

About 10 minutes before the approach buoy, the ship announces its arrival to the Port Control on channel 12. The Port Control informs the ship of current incoming and outgoing traffic.

For departure

About 10 minutes before the expected departure, the ship calls the Port Control on channel 12. The Port Control informs the ship of current incoming and outgoing traffic.

Besides getting information from the Port Control, all ships are under an obligation to stay continuously up to date about the port traffic by all accessible means, such as continuous monitoring of VHF channel 12, AIS data on radar or plotter images and, not least, visual observation.
